Summary of Patients Conditions:

We saw patient Kimberly Carr on February 28th, 2024. After reviewing her medical and dental history we decided to take a CBCT 3D scan which shows signs of low-grade infections in her jawbone around #1, #16, #17, & #32 wisdom teeth extraction sites, also known as Osteonecrosis/ Cavitations. Unlike many other diseases, she does not have innate capacity for self-healing from these infections which can have a huge burden on her currently weak immune system.

Inside cavitation, anaerobic bacteria flourish and deviant cells multiply. Cavitations act as a breeding ground for bacteria and their toxins. Research has shown these bacterial waste products are extremely potent and result in digestion problems, chronic fatigue, general feeling of malaise, and other chronic health problems. Cavitations can also cause blockages on the body's energy meridians and can exert far-reaching impact on the overall system. Investigation has revealed that some cavitations are reservoirs of huge amounts of mercury. Cavitations may be a source of low level or high-level stress on the entire body.

Kimberly will require Cavitation surgery as well as collaboration with other health care practitioners and therapeutic services to combat this disease. Treatment resolution will include, but is not limited to, the need for hyperbaric oxygen therapy, cranial sacral therapy, specialty IV treatment (both antibiotic and nutritional), as well as lymphatic drainage.
